
The Early Years



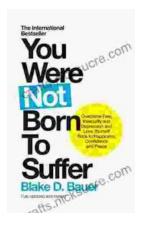
